

Volunteer on the programme as an adult leader



At 18 you can apply to join as a special constable or a regular officer



You can join the wider policing team as a police staff member

THE VOLUNTARY SIDE

You will be asked to complete a minimum of three hours voluntary work a month whilst on the cadet programme.

Voluntary work with the police may include:

Working with police officers and PCSOs at family events and helping to engage with members of the public

- Assisting with crime prevention

- Promoting the cadet programme at fun days and other events

- Testing purchases with trading standards and police officers

- Getting involved with trainee police officer role plays - Participating in social action projects
